IDF soldier convicted of manslaughter for killing wounded terrorist

In a controversial case highlighting Israeli army rules against killing terrorists who have already been neutralized, a special military court in Tel Aviv found 19-year-old Israeli soldier Sgt. Elor Azaria guilty of manslaughter on Wednesday.

Azaria was convicted of unlawfully killing Palestinian terrorist Abed al Fatah al-Sharif in Hebron on March 24, 2016 after the terrorist had been incapacitated and posed no apparent threat.

Sharif and another Palestinian terrorist, who soldiers had immediately shot dead, stabbed an IDF soldier in the West Bank near Hebron. The attack came during a wave of deadly stabbings conducted by Palestinians against both citizens and security forces in Israel between 2015 and 2016.

Azaria arrived at the scene several minutes after Israeli forces had regained control of the situation. Sharif, was alive but lying on the ground wounded when Azaria shot him in the head. The killing was captured on camera by B'Tselem, a human rights group that monitors the conduct of the Israeli army toward Palestinians in the West Bank.

The case showcased Israeli's determination to deal with accusations from both inside Israel and abroad that the IDF carries out extrajudicial killings. Under IDF rules of engagement it is forbidden to kill a combatant who has surrendered or who has been neutralized.

Azaria's arrest and subsequent trial has caused an uproar in Israel. As a whole, the country identifies on a deep and powerful level with its army. With terror and war a relentless and continuous threat since Israel's became a state in 1948, conscription is mandatory for both men and women – and young IDF soldiers are viewed as putting their lives at risk to protect the population.

The nation, therefore, desires to stand by soldiers and not "abandon" them in times of trouble. "This is a hard and painful day for all of us," Prime Minister Netanyahu said, capturing this sentiment. "The soldiers of the IDF are the sons and daughters of all of us."

Despite public outcry, the defense and military establishment decided to indict Azaria. Former Defense Minister Moshe Yaalon stated that he and IDF

Chief of Staff Gadi Eisenkot watched the B'Tselem footage and decided, "If we don't come out very clearly against this, that we denounce it, this behavior, then the Palestinians will accuse us — as they have for a long time — of committing extrajudicial killings, and that if we don't stop this immediately," there will be a Palestinian and international response.

Azaria has reportedly stated: "A terrorist posing a real danger to people in the field needs to be killed in order to neutralize the danger ... I had no backup from the Chief of Staff, from the ministers. I feel like they threw me to the dogs, maybe because of the media, the TV...The media showed the video in a biased way, without any sound ... Whoever was in the field knows that the video means nothing."

Irrespective of the particular facts in this instance, or what Azaria's intentions were, the case also highlights the fact that soldiers serving mandatory, rather than professional, conscription in the IDF face dangerous situations and are forced to make split second decisions.

Defense lawyers have announced their intent to appeal the decision. Sentencing is scheduled for Jan. 15.

Sharif's father, Yusir al Sharif, described the verdict as a "good step" and said he hoped no leniency will be shown in the sentencing.

Netanyahu, together with many others, has come out in favor of a pardon. The office of President Reuven Rivlin, who has the power to pardon, has issued a statement saying: "In the event that a pardons should be requested [by Azaria], it will be considered by the President in accordance with standard practices and after recommendations from the relevant authorities."

A Hanukkah miracle: Hikers discover menorah engraving in Judean hills

The Israel Antiquities Authority announced the discovery by hikers over the Hanukkah weekend an ancient engraving of menorah, a seven-branched lamp stand, on the walls of a water cistern in the Judean hills.

Members of the Israel Caving Club went spelunking* in a previously unexplored cave and found a cistern with dovecotes as well as iconic etchings and engravings on a nearby cave wall. They immediately reported this find to the Israel Antiquities Authority because they realized the importance and significance of their discovery.

Few symbols say "Jewish" like the

menorah. Instructions for the design of the lamp stand are found in Exodus 25:31-40 and it became synonymous with both the First and Second Temple eras.

*Spelunking (noun): The act of exploring a cave.

Experts say that to find a wall engraving of a menorah is rare. It corroborates scientific research regarding Jewish history and the demographics at the time of the Second Temple period.

That this was discovered during Hanukkah is quite symbolic.

Menorahs have been found on ancient clay lamps and other pieces of pottery but previous to this discovery, only two other engravings of menorahs have been found in this part of the Judean hills.

The base of the lamp stand etching is 3 feet long, which scientists say is a depiction of the menorah that was in the Second Temple in Jerusalem. The District Archaeologist of Ashkelon in the Israel Antiquities Authority Saar Ganor believes that the menorah was most likely etched onto the walls of the cistern around the time of Bar Kokhba. The dovecote also known as a columbarium is typical of the Second Temple time where doves and pigeons were an integral part of the sacrificial system for the Jewish people. Alongside the lamp stand was a cross which could have been added any time after that, as late as the fourth century.

The Israel Antiquities Authority will not reveal the exact location of the cave system to protect it and also to keep hikers safe. The hikers who made the discovery will be awarded a good citizenship certificate and get to participate in upcoming events in the area.

Hamas's Fatah and the No-State Solution

Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas declared that 2017 will be the "year of international recognition of the State of Palestine."

The melee in Gaza exposes as the lie that it is Abbas's repeated claim of a unified Fatah able to lead the Palestinians towards statehood. Incredibly, Abbas seeks global recognition of a Palestinian state at a time when the flames in his own backyard are set to engulf him and his questionable regime.

More bad news from the poll: if presidential elections were to be held today, Ismail Haniyeh, leader of the terrorist group Hamas, would beat Abbas by 49% to 45%.

Palestinians are now openly talking about two different Fatah factions. After Abbas's decision to strip the legislators of their parliamentary immunity, six Fatah PLC members participated in a Hamas-sponsored meeting of the PLC in the Gaza Strip. This was the first time since 2007 that such a move had been made.

Fatah leaders in the Gaza Strip, unlike their colleagues in the West Bank, are de facto recognizing the Hamas rule over the Gaza Strip. This is wonderful news for Hamas, whose leader, Ismail Haniyeh is likely to defeat Abbas in a presidential election.

The Fatah gunmen who marched in the Gaza Strip courtesy of Hamas are not supporters of Abbas. Instead, they represent the "other face" of Fatah -- the one that does not believe in any peace process with Israel and shares Hamas's ambition of destroying Israel.

During a celebration in Ramallah marking the 52nd anniversary of the

founding of his Fatah faction, Palestinian Authority (PA) President Mahmoud Abbas declared that 2017 will be the "year of international recognition of the State of Palestine." Hailing the recent anti-settlement UN Security Council resolution 2334, Abbas said he was prepared to work with the new administration of Donald Trump "to achieve peace in the region."

But while Abbas and his lieutenants were celebrating in Ramallah, at least 11 Palestinians were wounded in a scuffle that erupted between rival Fatah factions in the Gaza Strip. According to sources in the Gaza Strip, the fight broke out between Abbas loyalists and supporters of estranged Fatah leader Mohammed Dahlan. The confrontation, which was the most violent between the two sides in many years, is yet another sign of increasing schism in Fatah. Moreover, it is an indication of how Abbas's control over his own faction is slipping through his hands. Hamas policemen who were at the scene did not interfere to break up the fight between the warring Fatah activists.

The melee in Gaza exposes as the lie that is Abbas's repeated claim of a unified Fatah, able to lead the Palestinians towards statehood. Incredibly, Abbas seeks global recognition of a Palestinian state at a time when the flames in his own backyard are set to engulf him and his questionable regime.

Abbas says he wants to work with the Trump Administration to achieve peace in the Middle East, yet he cannot even achieve peace in his very own faction.

Abbas's speech coincided with a new public opinion poll that showed that 64% of Palestinians want him to step down. The poll, conducted by the Ramallah-based Palestinian Center for Policy and Survey Research, also showed that two-thirds of Palestinians do not believe that the current Fatah leadership can achieve their aspirations. The poll's findings show that the percentage of Palestinians who want Abbas to resign has risen over the past three months from 61% to 64%. More bad news from the poll: if presidential elections were to be held today, Ismail Haniyeh, leader of the terrorist group Hamas, would beat Abbas by 49% to 45%.

The results of the poll should not come as a surprise to those who have been monitoring Palestinian affairs for the past few years. Judging from the sentiments on the Palestinian street, there is good reason to believe that the 81-year-old Abbas, who is now in his 12th year of his four-year term in office, has long ago lost much of his credibility among his people. The real surprise is that only 64% of Palestinians want to see him gone.

Many Palestinians hold Abbas personally responsible for the continued and rapid deterioration in the Palestinian arena. They see his incompetent and failed leadership as the main reason behind the 2007 violent Hamas takeover of the Gaza Strip. As soon as Hamas started shooting, Abbas's fragile, corrupt and strife-ridden Palestinian Authority security forces collapsed. Critics of Abbas say that lack of leadership and decision-making on his part facilitated the Hamas seizure of the Gaza Strip.

Yet over the years, it has become evident that Abbas has not only lost the Gaza Strip and its two million inhabitants to Hamas, but that he is also losing control over his own Fatah faction there. Abbas has managed to alienate many Fatah leaders and activists in the Gaza Strip (most of whom are not necessarily affiliated with his arch-rival, Dahlan) to a point where Palestinians are now openly talking about two different Fatah factions.
