Terrorists open fire on officers north of Jerusalem

Border Police officers came under fire by Arab terrorists on Tuesday night near Beit Horon in Samaria, to the northwest of Jerusalem.

Reportedly the officers identified several Arab terrorists armed with guns driving in a car adjacent to the village of Tira along Highway 443, in a section of the road in Samaria to the northwest of the capital.

The officers are said to have approached the terrorists to check them, but one of the terrorists opened fire.

In response the soldiers shot back, although the attackers were able to escape in their car. No soldiers were wounded in the incident.

Shortly afterwards the Border Police spokesperson said in a statement: "a short time ago in the security fence route adjacent to the village Bayt Duqu, shots were fired by a passing car at a Border Police team."

"The combat soldiers responded with fire at the source of the gunfire. There are no wounded among the forces; Border Police and IDF forces launched a search," added the statement.

Israel to PA: Stop terror wave and peace talks can be renewed

Israel has conditioned a return to peace talks with the Palestinian Authority (PA) on an end to the current wave of terror, Walla! News reported on Wednesday, citing senior Palestinian officials.

According to the sources, during several recent high-level security-related meetings between Israeli representatives and PA representatives, the PA representatives raised the possibility of resuming peace talks in an attempt to restore calm to the region.

The officials reportedly set several conditions already made in previous discussions between Israel and the PA, including a freeze on construction in Judea and Samaria, an agreement on negotiations on the pre-1967 borders, and the release of 36 terrorist prisoners who were supposed to be released during the last round of talks that broke down in 2014..

However, according to Walla!, the Israeli officials from the defense establishment made clear that only if the current terror wave stops will Israel be able to consider resuming the peace process and making gestures to the PA.

Israel-PA peace talks have been frozen since 2014, when the PA unilaterally joined international organizations in breach of the conditions of the talks.

Since then, the PA has been on "diplomatic offensive" against Israel, joining international organizations such as the International Criminal Court (ICC) and submitting "evidence" of alleged Israeli war crimes against



Palestinians with the intent of having the court prosecute Israel.

PA officials who spoke to Walla! have emphasized that there have been no diplomatic channels between the PA and Israel since the cessation of talks conducted by former Minister Silvan Shalom and chief PLO negotiator Saeb Erekat. The officials told the news website that Israel made it clear even then that the talks could not lead to a change in policy so not much importance was attributed to them, even on the part of PA chairman Mahmoud Abbas.

They also said that despite the absence of a peace process, the Palestinian Authority maintains security coordination with Israel and works to prevent attacks, both by individual terrorists and by terrorist organizations, especially Hamas.

Earlier this week Kol Yisrael radio revealed that Erekat had proposed secret negotiations during a meeting on July 24 in Jordanian intelligence offices in Amman with Shalom, who was in charge of negotiations with the PA.

The station said that Erekat and Shalom met again three months later in Cairo, where Shalom notified Erekat that the Israeli government rejected his proposal about secret negotiations.

Israel's Gas Field to receive Iron Dome protection in 'Barak 8'

Head of the Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI) told Israeli press Wednesday that the newly developed 'Barak 8' system which will be installed on Israeli naval ships will be able to protect Israel's offshore gas assets.

Following the successful tests of the new system in India, Yossi Weiss, CEO of the IAI, said that part of the mission of the project is to protect the Israeli offshore gas assets.

"Technology is giving us the answer to the unfolding developments and threats of our enemies," he said in an interview with Walla! News.

Weiss added that the system will also be used for "other naval assets." Weiss said the system is capable of providing an answer for a wide range of naval threats, including 'sea-to-sea' missiles and torpedoes, air to sea missiles, and land to sea missiles. The system itself uses advanced radar technology which is far superior to previous systems.

The system also has a land based derivative which has been sold to the Indian Air Force. According to current plans between the two nations, that system will soon undergo testing as well.

Vice President for Missiles, Systems and Space Group of the IAI, Boaz Levy, also spoke about the missile tests yesterday and said that "both an Israeli as well as an Indian ship have the systems currently installed."

While the decision remains with the IDF as to when and how to install



further systems, Levy added that the system could be fully operational on Israeli Naval ships in a matter of months.

According to IAI standards, three successful tests are needed to certify a new program. The two trials which occurred in India in the past week, have completed the trial run phase for the 'Barak 8' system, and have classified it as ready for deployment.

City of Jerusalem to layoff thousands due to lack of budget

The Municipality of Jerusalem sent pink slips to 170 sanitation workers in the city on Thursday morning. The move is part of a larger scale plan to cut down on city spending by laying off close to 2,000 city employees over the coming months.

The layoffs will hit almost all sectors of employment under the city's supervision, including education, social welfare, maintenance, city operations and culture centers.

Due to the cutback, the layoffs are expected to have a significant impact on city services. According to sources at City Hall, if a commitment isn't decided upon today to provide extra funding for security guards in and around schools, then the level of security and the hours of security personnel will need to be scaled back to where it was before the recent wave of terror.

"The extensive cutbacks are being instituted due to the fact that as of January 1st, the city does not have a budget with which to pay employees or run planned programs throughout the city. Since there has not been any headway made in discussion with the Finance Ministry to submit the budgets for the city, we are forced to take this step. Under the current situation the city has to make a major cutback in social welfare, education and cultural expenditures. This is in an effort to comply with the law that forces Jerusalem to submit a balanced budget, and not one that is in the red."

City council sources also said that "Mayor Nir Barkat received unanimous support from all segments of the city council."

Barkat went on record to discuss the issue. "This decision is one that is far too difficult to bare, but unfortunately, we have no choice. The refusal of the Finance Ministry to transfer funds to the city's budget prevents us from continuing to provide the services that the city has offered its citizens and forced us to take this harsh measure to layoff workers that are necessary for the upkeep of this city. It has also caused us to cut deeply into the budgets for social services, education, and culture Which means that there will be thousands more city employees who will need to be laid off in our city."

"At this time of terror we expected to receive significant support from the government, and what we got was a cold shoulder. Without the transfer of governmental funds to the city of Jerusalem, we will have no refuge from making drastic and painful cuts which will bring about another major blow to



Israel's capital. One that will hit every single citizen of this city.”

The layoffs come just as the city of Jerusalem gears up for what appears to be this year's worst winter storm, which is expected to include snowfall over the weekend.

With rain, wind and cold, Israel's first winter storm upon us

The peak of Israel's first major winter storm will hit only on Thursday night - but rain, wind and cold are expected all day.

Local rains are expected to fall throughout the day from northern Israel to the northern Negev, intensifying during the afternoon. Toward the evening, snow will also begin to fall in the north.

Up to 20 centimeters (~8 inches) of snow are predicted on Mount Hermon, with another 15 anticipated in the Galilee. Jerusalem, however, will likely have to settle with some light snow on Friday, although sleet is more likely.

The worst part of the storm will occur overnight Thursday into Friday afternoon. Heavy flooding is anticipated and Israeli authorities are also concerned over damage to the electrical system.

The record low temperatures, however, are only expected Friday night until the afternoon on Saturday. The cold temperatures will be accompanied by cloudy skies and light rainfall, particularly in Israel's central region.

Rain may continue on Sunday, particularly in the north and additional snow is also predicted on Mount Hermon and in the Golan. Temperatures will be slightly warmer, but still unseasonably cold.

The Ministry of Health has published a list of safety recommendations for citizens, especially the elderly and parents with young children, in order to minimize damage caused by the cold.

These include heating the house at a constant 24°C (75.2°F) temperature, wearing warm clothing, and sealing all windows and doors to prevent cold from entering.

Magen David Adom is also preparing for the storm; it has added reinforcements to shifts and put dozens of ambulances on high alert.

The Israel Electric Company has taken preventive measures against potential power outages, and has ordered reinforcements to its teams, particularly in northern Israel.
