PA demands control over Iran cash handouts to terrorists

After Tehran announces \$7,000 payment per 'shahid,' Abbas spokesman says funds must go via PA, to avoid illegal interference in its internal affairs.

Nabil Abu Rudeineh, a PA presidency spokesman, was quoted in local media as saying that bypassing the Authority in handing out such funds would constitute illegal interference in internal Palestinian affairs.

Tehran announced last week assistance would be offered to families of those killed in the wave of Palestinian stabbing, car-ramming and shooting attacks that erupted in October 2015. The PA official did not reject the payments, but said such aid must follow official channels.

Iran should "send this money through official channels to the [PA's] Martyrs and Prisoners Foundation rather than relying on informal and circuitous routes," Abu Rudeineh said.

Iran's ambassador to Lebanon, Mohammad Fathali, said Wednesday that Tehran would offer \$7,000 to the families of each Palestinian killed in what he called the "Jerusalem intifada."

Iran will also give \$30,000 to Palestinian terrorists' families whose homes are destroyed by Israel, he told a news conference in Beirut.

The money pledged is in addition to the monthly aid paid since 1987 by an Iranian institution to families of Palestinians killed, the ambassador said.

Twenty-eight Israelis and three foreign nationals have been killed in a wave of Palestinian terrorism and violence since October. Nearly 170 Palestinians have also been killed, some two-thirds of them while attacking Israelis, and the rest during clashes with troops, according to the Israeli army.

Iran has been accused of providing support to Hamas, which runs the Gaza Strip and is a rival to Palestinian Authority President Mahmoud Abbas's Fatah party. Fatah dominates the Palestinian Authority. Palestinian economists have questioned whether Iran would be capable of distributing the aid to the families directly via banks since it could be considered "terrorism financing."

The day after Iran's announcement, Israel denounced the decision, with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu saying it showed Tehran was "continuing to aid terrorism." Netanyahu has also repeatedly accused the PA of helping to incite the current round of Palestinian terrorism.

The two terrorists are both 17-year-old and are from the Arab town of Karyut. One of them is identified with Hamas, and is the nephew of a Hamas suicide bomber.

The attack.

Shira Harel, the wife of Roi Harel, spoke to Arutz Sheva on Wednesday about how her husband managed to save her and their five kids from two Arab

terrorists who broke into their house early in the morning.

The two terrorists, aged 17, had breached into their town of Eli in Samaria from the adjacent village of Karyut. They were armed with clubs and knives. They also had brought an improvised handgun but they dropped it while getting through the barbed wire security fence of the town.

Shira Harel said she knew something was wrong as her husband, Roi, was loading up the car to leave for his reserve army duty, shouted that she go into the room and not come out and call security. One of their five children went out of their bedroom and he told them to get inside the door, as just down the hall he was struggling with the terrorists.

She said she can't imagine what could have happened if husband wasn't there, and went on to call him "a big hero," noting how he gave them instructions on exactly what to do even while still bleeding from his wounds to the head.

Roi Harel, the resident of the Hayovel neighborhood of Eli in the Binyamin region of Samaria who fought off two Arab terrorists who broke into his house and attacked him on Wednesday morning, later described the attack.

"I went to leave the house, to put things in the car, and two terrorists were standing at my door, youths, they looked around 15 or 16, dressed in dark clothes with wooden clubs in their hands," Harel told Army Radio.

"They jumped on me with the clubs and succeeded in entering the home."

Harel described how the terrorists nearly made it all the way to the bedrooms where his wife and five children were.

"After several minutes I succeeded in pushing them out as they were hitting me. I succeeded in pushing them, and closing the door," he said.

"After the security forces arrived and we opened the door, we saw that a knife of around 20 centimeters (8 inch) was stuck in the door. That apparently was the plan for afterwards."

"We need to remember that it isn't just me in a war for my home, we all are together in the war for our home," said Harel.

After the terrorists gave up on his home they tried to attack the soldiers and were shot dead.

Israel has returned the bodies of the two Palestinian Arab terrorists who were killed after carrying out Wednesday morning's terrorist attack in the community of Eli in the Binyamin region, Kol Yisrael radio reported.

Lieberman blasts return of terrorists' bodies, PA money transfer

Yisrael Beytenu head demands tougher responses to wave of terror, condemns transfer of money and terrorists bodies to PA.

Yisrael Beitenu chief Avigdor Lieberman condemned the government's decision to return the bodies of two terrorists less than a day after their attack in the town of Eli, citing it as the latest example of the coalition's inability to respond to terror.

Writing on Facebook on Thursday, Lieberman noted the sudden surge in terror attacks over the past two days, including an attack in Eli Wednesday

morning, a pair of stabbings in Har Bracha Wednesday evening, a shooting attack on a police car late Wednesday night, and a stabbing attack in the Jordan Valley Thursday morning.

Lieberman blasted the government's failure to halt the growing terror wave, noting its response to attacks is simply to return the bodies of terrorists killed in the act. He also took the opportunity to criticize Finance Minister Moshe Kachlon (Kulanu) for his decision last week to transfer half a billion shekels in withheld tax money to the Palestinian Authority.

"And what is the government's response to these attacks? A quick return – under 24 hours – of the bodies of the terrorists who attacked Eli and money transfers from the Israeli government to Abu Mazen (500,000,000 shekels) to fund the payments he'll give to the terrorists' families and to terrorists who are arrested."

Netanyahu moves to expel terrorists' families to Gaza

Prime Minister turns to Attorney General to examine possibility of expelling relatives who encourage and support terror.

Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu turned Wednesday to Attorney General Avichai Mandelblit, to explore the legal viability of expelling the families of terrorist murderers to Gaza.

The potential measure has long been advocated by some officials - including members of the government from the Jewish Home and Likud parties - as a means of deterring terrorists.

Families of terrorists who celebrate or knew about their attacks in advance already have their homes bulldozed as part of a raft of counterterrorism deterrence measures enacted by the government since the wave of terror began last year, but the option of expulsion has until now not been implemented.

"Many terror attacks in the last few months have been carried out by 'lone wolf' terrorists," Netanyahu wrote in his letter to Mandelblit. "These attackers sometimes come from families who encourage and assist their attacks.

"I request your legal opinion on the possibility of... distancing family members who aided terror to the Gaza Strip."

"I will explain that the use of this measure will bring about a significant decrease in acts of terror against the State of Israel, its citizens and residents," the PM added.

Supporters of the move within the government include Education Minister Naftali Bennett and Deputy Defense Minister Rabbi Eli Ben Dahan of the Jewish Home party, and Transportation Minister Haim Katz of Netanyahu's own Likud party.

Earlier this week, Katz once again voiced his support for expelling terrorists' families to Gaza.

"Our duty as a government is to save lives, and expelling the families of terrorists will decrease the motivation among those minors to carry out attacks," he said, referring to the young ages of many attackers, most of whom are not formally members of terrorist organizations.

"I am sure that after the expulsion of several individual families this

'terror of individuals and minors' will stop," he added. "This is our obligation. We are fighting for our home and our job is to make sure this stops."

If plans to expel terrorists' families from the country altogether face too many legal obstacles, MK Motti Yogev (Jewish Home) has suggested relocating them to isolated areas in Israel's southern Negev Desert.

"No son wants his father and mother to find themselves with no livelihood, and his brothers without an education," Yogev said.

Mob Attacks, Nearly Lynches Israeli Arab Man

An Israeli Arab man was attacked and nearly lynched by an angry mob near Jerusalem last week, but not for any of the reasons you might initially imagine.

The man was driving through the Jerusalem suburb of Beit Hanina, an Arab neighborhood, when he was surrounded by a mob of young men wielding knives and metal rods.

The Israeli Arab victim's crime? He was speaking on his cell phone in Hebrew.

Assuming he was a Jew, the mob stoned the victim's car. After realizing he was Arab, they screamed that he should be ashamed of himself.

"I thought I was in a murder situation, they really lynched me," the victim, Abu Rahman, told Israeli news portal Walla!.

Abu Rahman called for help and was quickly and safely extracted from Beit Hanina by police.

This is the atmosphere of crazed hatred in which Israel must try to make peace. It speaks to the fact that even if a document is signed, there will be no genuine peace on the ground until the people are educated for coexistence, an education these young Arabs have clearly not received.

February heat wave exacerbates drought in Israel

Three years of hotter-than-usual Februarys in a row, coupled with an ongoing drought have hit Israel's water supply.

Israel is facing a serious long-term water shortage, reports the Israeli Water Authority, as February's abnormally high temperatures marked Israel's third year of drought.

The Water Authority notes that since 2014, the rainy season in Israel has been abnormally short, with larger than normal drop-offs in the amount of precipitation in the month of February.

This year, February saw a 50% drop in rain. The February heatwave exacerbated the dearth of rain, drying up soil far earlier than usual. That means that even with greater amounts of precipitation in March, underground aquifers are unlikely to be replenished.

Because of the relatively dry winter, Israel's water supply will be tighter, leading to higher prices for fruit and vegetables.
