Poll: 92% of Israeli businesses don't want to open on Shabbat

Ninety-two percent of Israeli business owners say that they don't want to open on Shabbat, according to a recent study, while 98% of businesses said they wouldn't take customers' calls on the Jewish holy day. These were the statistics that emerged from a study conducted on Israeli businesses.

CofaceBDI, an Israeli Business information group, conducted the study on 135 businesses across the country. The results of the study, contrary to opinions voiced by the secular community, revealed that most business owners don't want to open on Shabbat.

Contrary to this, only 8% noted that they are interested in opening their shops on Shabbat. Ninety-eight percent of respondents said they would not answer calls from customers on Shabbat.

In addition, 21% of businesses said that their business would have more proceeds if it were open on Shabbat while 32% said their proceeds would remain the same. Nearly half (47%) said their proceeds would be lower if they opened on Shabbat.

More than four-fifths (81%) said the decision to open for business on Sabbath should be left to the discretion of the owner and 19% said it should not be.

Just over half (51%) said public transportation should run on Shabbat.

The 'Shabbat Shivyon' organization, which represents the interests of businesses that are working to remain closed on Shabbat, said that "the results of this poll show that business owners are not interested in remaining open on Shabbat but would rather spend quality time with their families on a weekly basis."

Gaza Strip population said to reach 2 million

Newborn Waleed Shaath in Rafah brings Palestinian enclave above new threshold, Hamas says; UN says territory could be 'unlivable' by 2020

"There are now more than two million residents in the Gaza Strip after the baby Waleed Shaath was born last night in Rafah in southern Gaza," Iyad Bezm, a spokesman for the Hamas-run interior ministry, told AFP.

The ministry said the population of the Gaza Strip was now 50.66 percent male and 49.34% female.

The 2 million and oneth person, a girl named Lana Ayad, was born shortly afterwards, the ministry said.

Gaza, a tiny enclave squeezed between Egypt, Israel and the Mediterranean Sea and just 12 kilometers (7.5 miles) across at its widest point, has one of the highest population densities in the world, according to the United Nations.

The territory could be "unlivable" by 2020, the UN said last year, due in large part to "high population density and overcrowding."

Socio-economic conditions in Gaza today are currently "at their lowest point since 1967," when Israel took control of the territory following the Six Day War, the report said.



Israel pulled out of Gaza in 2005, removing both settlers and soldiers, and Hamas, an Islamist terror group dedicated to destroying Israel, seized control from Mahmoud Abbas's Palestinian Authority two years later. Israel and Egypt maintain a security blockade on the territory, in order to prevent Hamas, which has fired thousands of rockets into Israel, dug tunnels into Israel and waged three wars against it, from importing more weaponry. UN officials have called for the blockade to be lifted.

UNESCO passes resolution denying Jewish ties to Temple Mount

Resolution passed Thursday amidst lobbying efforts by Israel and supporters; Resolution recognizes Temple Mount as sacred to Muslims only.

The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) voted in a resolution that denies Jewish heritage and history to the Temple Mount on Thursday. The vote for the resolution is part of consistent anti-Israel efforts and successes in denying Jewish ties to holy sites in Jerusalem.

The resolution acknowledges the religious significance of Jerusalem to Christianity, Judaism and Islam, but claims the Temple Mount, the most significant and important religious site for Jews, is only sacred to Muslims.

The proposal was submitted by Algeria, Egypt, Lebanon, Morocco, Qatar and Sudan last year, a vote in July postponed following a coup attempt in Turkey in July. The proposal has been advanced and pushed forward in international bodies by the Palestinians as continued efforts to remove Jewish and Israeli history from holy sites.

A reported 24 countries voted in favor, with 26 abstaining. The United States, Britain, Estonia, Germany, Holland and Lithuania voted against the resolution.

In June, UNESCO adopted a resolution passed in April that the Temple Mount would be referred to as Al-Aqsa in all official documents and official reference. Just a few weeks later, UNESCO voted to return the holy site to the "historical status quo" before the 1967 war. Israel has been lobbying against the efforts to eradicate Jewish history from holy sites, mainly in Jerusalem. Earlier this week, Israel sought assistance from the Holy See on the grounds that denying Jewish heritage to the Temple Mount is harmful to Christians and Jews alike.

Israel's ambassador to UNESCO, Carmel Shama-Hacohen, responded to the vote Thursday, calling the Palestinians efforts a failure as European states did not support the resolution. She stated "The Palestinians have lost all support in Europe, including France, Spain and even Sweden. Along with the shift of position of key countries such as India and Argentina to abstention, the vote constitutes a significant achievement compared to the opening conditions for prior votes... There is no connection of another people to another place in the world that comes close to the strength and depth of our connection to Jerusalem from a religious, historical and national perspective, a connection that has stood the test of 2,000 years."

Prime Minister Netanyahu responded to UNESCO's decision releasing the statement "The theatre of the absurd continues at the UN. Today UNESCO adopted its second decision this year denying the Jewish people's connection to the Temple Mount, our holiest site for over three thousand years. What's next? A



UNESCO decision denying the connection between peanut butter and jelly? Batman and Robin? Rock and roll? Is it any wonder the UN has become a moral farce when UNESCO, the UN body tasked with preserving history, denies and distorts history? Israel will continue to fight the lies, hatred and double standards at the UN. Israel will prevail because truth will prevail.”

Riots erupt in east Jerusalem on Jewish Yom Kippur,

A 20-year-old Arab man who threw firebombs at border police during a riot in southeast Jerusalem’s Silwan neighborhood was shot dead shortly after Yom Kippur commenced on Tuesday night, as police responded to two other riots in Arab areas in the capital. According to police, rioting broke out in Isawiya, Jebel Mukaber and Silwan less than an hour after Judaism’s holiest day began.

“Arabs living in these neighborhoods threw petrol bombs and rocks at officers who responded to a dangerous and life-threatening situation,” said Police spokesman Micky Rosenfeld on Wednesday night.

“One resident in Silwan, who threw a petrol bomb at officers at close range, was injured critically and died. Police attempted to treat him for his injury, but local residents removed his body from the scene and he died a short time later.”

The dead man was identified in Arab media as Silwan resident Ali Atef Ebrahim Shoyoukhi, 20, who was released from prison earlier this year after serving a 15-month sentence. Shoyoukhi was buried a few hours after later. Police dispersed the remaining rioters using non-lethal force, Rosenfeld said, adding that no other serious injuries were reported. Despite the violence in east Jerusalem, Rosenfeld said thousands of Jews prayed at the Western Wall in the Old City without incident.

Over 3,500 officers from multiple units have been canvassing the capital during the High Holy Days, Rosenfeld said.

Also on Tuesday night, Palestinians fired at soldiers near the West Bank security barrier in the vicinity of the village of Ni’lin. Soldiers who were dispatched to the area by an army lookout returned fire and the suspects fled, the IDF said. Units from the Efraim Territorial Brigade conducted searches in the area and arrested a number of suspects following the exchange of fire. The closure imposed by the IDF on the West Bank was gradually lifted after the end of the holiday on Wednesday night.

In the Upper Galilee over the holiday, shots were fired at three houses of the same family in Beit Jann, with no injuries reported. While in Deir el-Asad, near Karmiel, the house of a 30-year-old local was damaged from gunfire, with no injuries reported. In both cases the background is unknown and police are conducting an investigation.

Another shooting occurred in the Beduin village of Shakib al-Salam, southeast of Beersheba, where a man was wounded and treated in fair condition at the city’s Soroka-University Medical Centre. Meanwhile, two days after a terrorist shot and killed police Special Patrol Adv.-St.-Sgt.-Maj. Yosef Kirma, 29, and Levana Malichi, 60, a former Knesset employee, and wounded six others in a driveby attack in the capital on Sunday, Jerusalem Deputy Mayor Meir Turgeman called for a complete shutdown of all Arab construction in the city. During an interview



with Israel Radio, Turgeman, who also chairs the municipality's Planning and Building Committee, also demanded that all terrorists' families be deported to the Gaza Strip.

PM: Israel is a strong country that is becoming stronger

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu praises quick police action in preventing major terrorist attack in Jerusalem on Monday, thanks all members of the Israeli security forces • PM: Israel is a military, economic, technological and diplomatic power. "Yesterday was a sad day in Jerusalem. I would like to send condolences to the family of our friend, Levana Malihi," Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said Monday at a toast to the New Year with the employees of the Prime Minister's Office, referring to a terrorist shooting on Sunday that claimed the lives of Malihi, a former Knesset employee, and Border Policeman 1st Sgt. Yossi Kirma.

"I think that whoever was in the Knesset remembers her radiant smile, and we cry together with her family and with the family of the heroic policeman, Yossi Kirma, who pursued the terrorist and lost his life and without a doubt saved many lives. And of course we send our condolences to his fellow policeman, who is also a hero, and to all the other wounded. In this case, painful as it may be, there is no doubt that a terrible disaster was prevented by the quick, determined, and fearless action that was imbued with the fighting spirit of the Israel Police. I salute them, along with all the citizens of Israel," Netanyahu continued.

The prime minister said that the country was in the midst of the High Holidays, known as a time when "those who incite and fan the flames of terrorism" continually try to provoke violence and clashes. "All citizens must be alert, certainly the security forces, who work day and night to protect us, and be a buffer and a wall between these murderers and the Israeli public. I salute the police personnel and soldiers, the men and women of the Shin Bet security agency, and all security services. We know that without their action, our reality would be different, and thanks to their action we succeed in safeguarding our security, our fabric of life, and our state," Netanyahu said.

The prime minister went on to say that the state of Israel was bringing about a "fundamental change in the status of the Jewish people, which had been a people without strength, without the ability to defend itself, to be strong in its homeland, which has gradually become an international force.

"This force is drawing other countries to us. It's not just military power, but our economic, technological and intelligence power. This is what the nations of the world greatly appreciate, and there is also an additional strength, and that is diplomatic strength. Hardly a day goes by in which heads of state and government and foreign ministers and senators and others do not come here. They come here and are drawn to the strength. The strength forces alliances and with strength one makes peace. The State of Israel is a very strong country that is becoming even stronger, and everything, in the end, leads here, to this office, that is to say, to you," Netanyahu said.

The prime minister thanked his staff for their part in his office's work and wished them an easy Yom Kippur fast. "May you be inscribed in the Book of Life," he told them.
